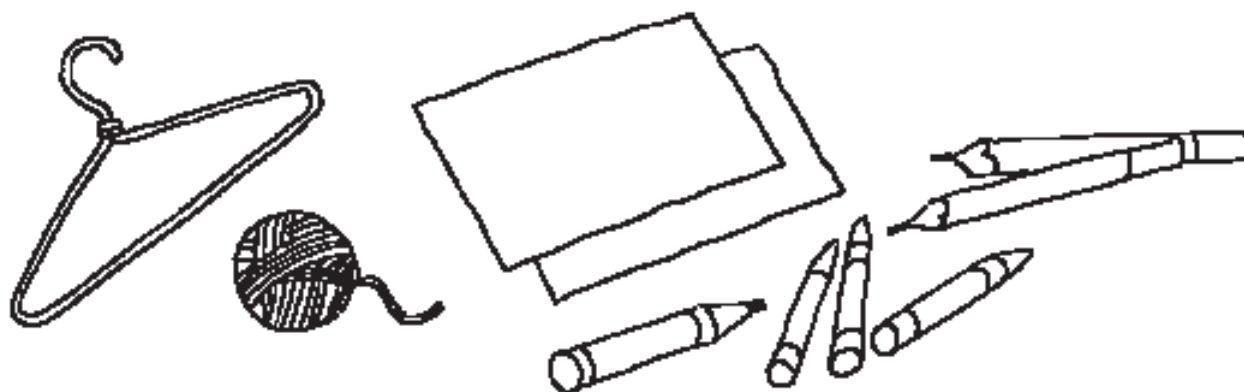
Mobile
